Fr Benjamin writes ...

It's when you no longer have something that you miss it. We've currently lost the door latch to the front of the church, meaning the front door keeps swinging and slamming. I miss the latch. I keep on misplacing things in the kitchen, like the colander that was the perfect size for the cupboard. I wish I still had it. Don't mistake me, as I do not obsess over these little things, since I never gave them a second thought when they were there. It's just now I note their absence and my true appreciation for them.

Recently, I was in more-or-less in the middle-of nowhere, in a tiny hamlet. All there was were cottages and cows. It would take an age to walk to the nearest church, which would inevitably be locked, and so I missed – truly and deeply – being able to go and kneel before Our Blessed Lord in the Tabernacle. When I returned home, the first place I went to was the sanctuary to visit Him, pray to Him and enjoy His Presence. It was like being refreshed by ice cold water on the hottest of days, coming home after a long trip away, or seeing a long-lost friend. It was relief, comfort, and in a word, blessedness.

Yes, we are truly blessed to be able to visit Our Blessed Lord, present among us in His Tabernacle – and for forty-eight per week house exposed upon His Altar – and simply be with Him. We can do this every day. When I could not do this, I missed Him terribly in that very real way of His being with us.

Please, I ask you, never to take this holy gift for granted. If you are passing by, come into the Church and visit Our Blessed Lord who dwells in the light of the red candle. He is waiting, He is Present, He is there.

Simon Peter once asked Him a beautiful question: "Lord, to Whom shall we go to?". He then answered His own enquiry: "You have the message of eternal life." (Jn 6:68). In any situation, and at any moment, it is always the right thing to turn to God. There is also the greatest gift, which is His Presence in the Tabernacle, to which we are all welcome to turn to and be with. He calls, He waits. He is there. Go to Him.

Christ loves the Church, because it is his body

Give way to one another in obedience to Christ. Wives should regard their husbands as they regard the Lord, since as Christ is head of the Church and saves the whole body, so is a husband the head of his wife; and as the Church submits to Christ, so should wives to their husbands, in everything. Husbands should love their wives just as Christ loved the Church and sacrificed himself for her to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would be glorious, with no speck or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but he feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body – and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one body. This mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.

John 6:60-69


Who shall we go to? You are the Holy One of God

After hearing his doctrine many of the followers of Jesus said, 'This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it?' Jesus was aware that his followers were complaining about it and said, 'Does this upset you? What if you should see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before?

'It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh has nothing to offer. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life.

'But there are some of you who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the outset those who did not believe, and who it was that would betray him. He went on, 'This is why I told you that no one could come to me unless the Father allows him.' After this, many of his disciples left him and stopped going with him.

Then Jesus said to the Twelve, 'What about you, do you want to go away too?' Simon Peter answered, 'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.'
