Fr Benjamin writes ...

Being interrupted, in whatever way, can be irritating, especially if we are eager to complete what we are doing. Yet central to the story of today's Gospel passage with the calling of the first four disciples, Andrew, Peter, James and John, is the fact that the Lord comes to them as a colossal interruption. He does this, not only in the way of stopping what they are doing as they mend their nets, but moreover, through His entrance into their lives, they drop everything and follow Him.

This fast-pace response, which St Mark is eager to give us as the model response of a disciple, may seem incomprehensible to many, and unrealistic to some, but considered in its true context, it is sublime. We know, for instance, that Andrew had been earnestly waiting for the Messiah to come. He wanted God to take charge of the world and be the sovereign over all, in His mercy, justice and love. When he found this was beginning to happen, and that God's Kingdom was finally entering into the world, he was delighted and everything, including his livelihood, seemed insignificant compared to being part of this heavenly Kingdom. We don't know what it was James and John saw in the Lord, but they also leave their family in order to follow Him.

Clearly, these four men were looking for something more, and when they saw it in the Person of Jesus of Nazareth, they were determined to be a part of it. It is not uncommon to make decisions based on our 'gut feeling', and it was better to follow and see who this Man was rather than miss it and regret it for eternity.

We must all take the chance to follow the Lord, whilst we have the chance. We must be prepared to be interrupted by the Lord if that is what it takes to follow Him, to know Him and to come to love Him. If that is what it takes to enter into His heavenly Kingdom and the eternal love and life He offers, then we need to ask for the strength and the wisdom to generously respond to His call: Follow me.

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told you to.' Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it. Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least.

God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour, and God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.

Going on a little further, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they too were in their boat, mending their nets. He called them at once and, leaving their father Zebedee in the boat with the men he employed, they went after him.
