Fr Benjamin writes ...

There are many words, even in English, which can be equated with love: adore, cherish, treasure and so many more. Somehow, they do not equate to what both the Book of Deuteronomy and Our Blessed Lord speak of when they command: "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength." The word used in the Hebrew of Deuteronomy is quite difficult to translate. It has the sense of a stubborn doggedness, of remaining faithful come what may. The word used by Our Blessed Lord for love, *agape*, is even more untranslatable when trying to convey its sheer strength and power. The best I can do is to describe it as a torrent of self-giving, a sacrificial love that expects nothing in return but gives all. St John of Avila put it beautifully in his *Treatise on the Love of God*: "He who loves, gives himself with everything he has, until he has nothing left" (No.1).

You can see how, from this, we can often debase the concept of love when we say how much we love chocolate, or love a television programme – "like", yes, but *love* as revealed by God? When we see love in the way it is described and seen in the scriptures, then perhaps we will apply it more carefully. I say, 'see love', because it has been revealed and shown. The world has seen this love in the form of a person and in a supreme act. Love came as a man, and that Son of Man emptied Himself of His glory and even of His Blood in order to give His whole Self to us. He stuck with the Will of His Father, loving Him in the sense of Deuteronomy, and outpoured Himself in *agape*.

There is then another marvel: we are called to experience this love for ourselves, in fidelity and in self-giving, so that the Presence of God can still be known and lived, seen and followed. Love can only be known, not as obedience to a command, but as for what it is, a pure gift. It is this which brings the Kingdom of God on earth, and it is this which gives us direct contact with the living God.

God bless you all and may the light of His Face shine upon you.

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord the God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow.

Second reading Hebrews 7:23-28

Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Gospel Mark 12:28-34

'You are not far from the kingdom of God'

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.
