#### Fr Benjamin writes ...

I have not sat an exam for over ten years. I sincerely hope I will not have to sit another one again, at least, not in this life. God willing, my next exam will be the Last Judgment, and how I do will all depend upon how I prepare for it. A character in my favourite novel by Morris West, *The Shoes of the Fisherman* is a fastidious priest who nonetheless imparts a pearl of wisdom, saying that time is the currency of salvation.

We can waste so much time. But what is the waste? Nothing less than the preparation for that final exam, nothing less than our salvation. "Watch yourselves", Our Blessed Lord warns us, "or your hearts will be coarsened with debauchery and drunkenness and the cares of life". He is telling us not to waste time on things that will never help us, and will never be able to give us what we desire, which is the happiness of our liberation in God.

It may not be that we waste time with drink and debauchery, but certainly with the cares of life. How much time, I ask myself, have I spent ranting and raving when things don't go my way? How many times have I stewed in my negative feelings about people, when all the time I could have been praying for them and preparing my soul?

This may all sound a little over-dramatic, but that is the point of Our Blessed Lord's sobering words: we need to be on the watch, watching ourselves in what we do and how we spend the currency of our salvation, which is, literally, the time of our lives. It needs to be spent not in selfishness but service, not in lust but love, not in hubris but humility, not coarsened but purified. Then, and with God's help only then, will we be prepared for that final exam, and fulfil the desire we sing in the Responsorial psalm, "To You, O lord, I lift up my soul". With such preparation as this Our Blessed Lord's Coming— His Second Advent — will not be something to fear, but an event to look forward to and desire, a time "to stand with confidence before the Son of Man".

Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.

'But watch yourselves lest your hearts be weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and cares of this life, and that day come upon you suddenly like a trap. For it will come upon all who dwell on the face of the whole earth. But stay awake at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are going to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'
