Fr Benjamin writes ...

Obstacles – this is not my favourite word. I shouldn't think anybody likes it or what it signifies. Our Blessed Lord speaks of obstacles in today's Sunday Gospel, but most ominously of all, He speaks of His disciples as being potential obstacles, obstacles to faith. In short, the Lord is concerned that we may put people off from living their faith, either through bad example or scandal, or through our own lukewarmness. He is also concerned that we may discourage those who are new to the life of faith – "Alas for the world that there should be such obstacles!" He cries.

One of the greatest obstacles in the Church today is talking about God – we do not do it as much as we should. In fact, this is all the Church should do. There are some days where I speak more about leaking roofs than I do of Good News of Jesus Christ. This simply should not and cannot be. I'm not saying roofs and ceilings are not important, as I think they are (as well as boilers), but they are not more important than that which we are here to live and preach: the Kingdom of God. As soon as the Church starts to speak more of the things of the world, and less of God, then it puts a millstone around its own neck. The Lord's solution is simple. If it is taking the rightful place of God – which is the biblical definition of idolatry – then we must "cut it out". In other words, if we find that there are things in life which distract us so much that they take us away from seeing God as our primary focus of worship, we will forget Him and end up in the bad places from which God sent His Son to save us.

Obstacles can take many forms, both blatant and subtle, but they only become such things when they obscure our life with God, and from knowing Him as Love. Nothing, surely is more important or beautiful than the reality that God is Love and that we can know Him and be in perpetual and everlasting communion with Him?

The Lord came down in the Cloud. He spoke with Moses, but took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. When the spirit came on them they prophesied, but not again.

Two men had stayed back in the camp; one was called Eldad and the other Medad. The spirit came down on them; though they had not gone to the Tent, their names were enrolled among the rest. These began to prophesy in the camp. The young man ran to tell this to Moses, 'Look,' he said, 'Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.' Then said Joshua the son of Nun, who had served Moses from his youth, 'My Lord Moses, stop them!' Moses answered him, 'Are you jealous on my account? If only the whole people of the Lord were prophets, and the Lord gave his Spirit to them all!'

The Lord hears the cries of those you have cheated

An answer for the rich. Start crying, weep for the miseries that are coming to you. Your wealth is all rotting, your clothes are all eaten up by moths. All your gold and your silver are corroding away, and the same corrosion will be your own sentence, and eat into your body. It was a burning fire that you stored up as your treasure for the last days. Labourers mowed your fields, and you cheated them – listen to the wages that you kept back, calling out; realise that the cries of the reapers have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. On earth you have had a life of comfort and luxury; in the time of slaughter you went on eating to your heart's content. It was you who condemned the innocent and killed them; they offered you no resistance.

Gospel Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48

Do not stop anyone from working a miracle in my name

John said to Jesus, 'Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name; and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him.' But Jesus said, 'You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us.

'If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.

'But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out.'
