Fr Benjamin writes ...

You may wonder why, when we hear the Gospels translated into all the languages of the world we maintain some original words from Our Blessed Lord's mother tongue of Aramaic. We encounter one such word today, impossible to pronounce, but nonetheless hugely significant: *ephphatha*. Literally, it means, "be opened". When the evangelist uses the Lord's own word in His own language it is because he is emphasizing the extra attention we should pay it, and it is also likely that it is a personal memory of someone who witnessed the event.

"Be opened" – Our Blessed Lord said this to "a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech" in the Decapolis region, which was predominately not Jewish, but pagan. The Lord not only opens the man's ears so that he can hear and speak, He also opens him to the reality of God. The man had probably heard little or nothing of God, not because he was deaf, but because of where he was from. He would not have heard the Scriptures because he would not have been brought up to do so; he would not have engaged with God in prayer, because he would never have known the God to whom he could speak.

It is for this reason that the *Ephphatha* prayer is used in the Baptismal liturgy, where the newly baptised have their ears blessed to hear the Word of God and their mouth is then blessed, so that they may proclaim that Word. Through Baptism, and through living their whole life in the ambit of the Church, they have been opened to the great possibilities of God: to hear Him and to proclaim what they hear.

It is a great privilege to hear God's Word, especially when it is proclaimed at the Holy Mass, and to hear it in the knowledge that it is God speaking directly to each one of us. He wills for that word to be echoed in our own speech and way of living, so that others may find an opening through us to this Divine and saving communication. This word, *Ephphatha*, was so etched on the memory of one who heard the Lord speak it that it has been spoken and echoed through the millennia. It is for us to be opened to the Lord's Word, have it etched into our mind and echoed through our lives.

Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy; for water gushes in the desert, streams in the wasteland, the scorched earth becomes a lake, the parched land springs of water.

My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people. Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed man, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats'; then you tell the poor man, 'Stand over there' or 'You can sit on the floor by my foot-rest.' Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that?

Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.

Gospel Mark 7:31-37

'He makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak'

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was I oosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'
