Fr Benjamin writes ...

"Decisions, decisions" goes the phrase. Some may disagree, but I am a decisive person. I may not come to a decision very quickly, but once I have assessed all the information that is required, it's full steam ahead.

For the Twelve disciples in today's Gospel passage, it is also decision time. Not only has Simon Peter decided he knows Our Blessed Lord's identity as the Christ; he also needs to decide along with the eleven, whether he should continue following Christ.

When Christ confirms that He is indeed the Lord's Anointed, the Son of the living God, He also speaks about what that identity entails. To follow Him as Christ does not mean an easy life. It does not mean preferential treatment or honour from society. On the contrary, it means following Him where He leads, and He describes in stark detail the destination: to suffering, death on a Cross and rising from the dead. It was a far cry from what Simon Peter would have expected Him to say.

When Simon Peter takes Our Lord aside to remonstrate with Him, Christ interprets his words as a real temptation not to go to the Cross. That explains the strength of His rebuke. When Simon Peter finally knows that Christ is fully intent on going to Jerusalem, to be betrayed, handed-over and killed, he needs to decide whether or not to continue to follow Him. The same is true for all the rest of the eleven. The same is true for us.

We may be called to follow Our Lord on difficult paths, paths we would prefer not to go down, but in the end it comes down to a subject of another significant conversation Simon Peter has with the Lord: Love. "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" It is only after that He says, "Follow me".

The same applies to us. Do we love the Lord, and follow Him only in the good times, or are we willing to embrace the Cross for love of Him as well? When it comes to the moment of greatest decision, what do we say, who do we follow and so Who do we say Jesus is?

The Lord has opened my ear.

For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle.

The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

My vindicator is here at hand. Does anyone start proceedings against me? Then let us go to court together. Who thinks he has a case against me? Let him approach me. The Lord is coming to my help, who will dare to condemn me?

I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living

Second reading James 2:14-18

If good works do not go with it, faith is quite dead

Take the case, my brothers, of someone who has never done a single good act but claims that he has faith. Will that faith save him? If one of the brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, 'I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty', without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead.

This is the way to talk to people of that kind: 'You say you have faith and I have good deeds; I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds – now you prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show.'

Gospel Mark 8:27-35

The Son of Man is destined to suffer grievously


Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But, turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.'
