Fr Benjamin writes ...

From where I sit or stand at Holy Mass on a Sunday, it is interesting that many people sit in the same seats. Some prefer the front, others the back. I myself would be a middle row person. In this Sunday's Gospel the disciples James and John are decidedly front pew people. Is it because they want to be able to see and hear more? Do they in some way wish to be nearer to God by being close to all the action? It appears not.

James and John ask to sit in the Lord's glory, one at His right hand and the other at His left. They know and believe Him to be God's Messiah, and they have heard Him proclaimed the Son of God. They desire to benefit from His glory, His power, and to be known to be close to Him. Yes, they undoubtedly loved Him, but perhaps they are also at some level seeking to benefit from this relationship.

Whilst they seek glory, Our Blessed Lord offers them what He calls "The Cup". This would likely be what Judaism of the time referred to as the Cup of Redemption, which was drunk at the Passover meal and signified the slaying of the Passover Lamb in sacrifice to God. Jesus offers His disciples to partake in His mission of salvation; to save the world by the shedding of His Blood as a witness that God is self-giving, love is self-giving, and a disciple of love must be self-giving rather than in any way self-seeking.

Being told this, would James and John shift to the back? Would any of us? Or would we desire to move to the front where the action is, the action of the Cross where the Son offers Himself to the Father for the forgiveness of sins? This is the only greatness God is interested in, which is not to be served but to serve.


Gospel Mark 10:35-45

The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for many

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'
