#### Fr Benjamin writes ...

Last Wednesday we joined with people from across the country in a Prayer Vigil, praying for the dignity of human life to be upheld, particularly by our legislators. It was a very peaceful, Holy Hour. At the centre of all the debates, emotive stories and fears for the future, Our Blessed Lord was suddenly there at the centre of it all where He belongs. Praying before Him, there was no debate, there were no appeals to the heart and there was certainly no fear simply because of His Presence. He, Who proclaimed Himself the Resurrection and the Life was the sign we all look for, speaking the words we strain to listen to. He speaks to us today, saying "My words will not pass away" in the Sunday Gospel passage. The words He spoke two thousand years ago will never pass away, and the words He spoke were always about giving us life – God's life. "I have come to give life that you may have it to the full" (John 10:10). Amidst the storm of opinions, arguments and debates, we need to listen to what it is the Lord has to say: "Know that He is near" he also reminds us today.

To be effective messengers of the Gospel, we first of all need to be people of prayer, praising and especially listening to the Lord. If we do not listen, or even take the time to listen, we cannot hear Him, and we cannot proclaim what He says. We must be in vigil in order to be vigilant. In that way we will always be ready "for that day or hour" which no one can predict in its coming.

The Lord's words to us today about when He will come again is a potent reminder that we must have at least half an eye and ear on Him when we speak, when we act and when we make decisions. The things we do in this life will have consequences in the next, and since the Lord will come to bring the fullness of His Presence and Kingdom, He should always be a part – a central part – of what we do and say, especially in important matters. The comforting words of the first reading will then be more likely to be fulfilled: "The learned will shine as brightly as the vault of heaven, and those who have instructed many in virtue, as bright as stars for all eternity" (Dan 12:3).

#### When all sins have been forgiven, there can be no more sin-offerings

All the priests stand at their duties every day, offering over and over again the same sacrifices which are quite incapable of taking sins away. He, on the other hand, has offered one single sacrifice for sins, and then taken his place forever, at the right hand of God, where he is now waiting until his enemies are made into a footstool for him. By virtue of that one single offering, he has achieved the eternal perfection of all whom he is sanctifying. When all sins have been forgiven, there can be no more sin offerings.

Gospel Mark 13:24-32

#### The stars will fall from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven.

'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.'
