# PARISH OF THE HOLY FAMILY

## Fr Benjamin writes ...

"Master, let me see again". This is possibly one of the most heartrending cries to be found in the Scriptures. In calling out to Our Blessed Lord, the blind man speaks the cry of every Christian heart, "let me see again." Let me see again the innocence of my Baptism, let me see again the purity of soul that You give me when You forgive my sins. Lord, let me see Your face again. It is the natural cry of all of us who, having known the face of the Lord, find ourselves turned away from Him. We cannot see Him – and we miss Him.

The beautiful question the Lord put to this desperate soul, is also one addressed to each of us: "What do you want Me to do for you?" This is a very personal question, not so much in the sense that it applies to each of us individually but that it comes from the Lord personally: "What do you want *Me* to do for you?" Only the Son of God could give the man his sight. Only the God incarnate could help him to see his God.

It is only the Lord Jesus Christ Who can give us the greatest gift we seek, which is the sight of God. Each day that we spend on earth must be a response to this gift and a constant seeking of the Face of God, in innocence, in purity, and of course in self-giving love. There is a desperation in the man's voice that relates a trauma of not seeing God. We must not underestimate the traumatising effect of things that blind us from seeing God – that which we see on the internet, that which we hear in harmful lyrics of music, and that which we say and do against one another.

There is, however, a way out of this blindness, and that is to say to Our Blessed Lord, with all our hearts, "Lord, let me see again", let me see you again and never let me be parted from you. When the Lord gives us the sight of His beautiful Face, of His holiness and love, through His forgiveness and gentle words, He gives us the assurance that we are not in darkness, we are not alone – God is for us, and God is with us.

God bless you all and may the light of His Face shine upon you.

The Lord says this: Shout with joy for Jacob! Hail the chief of nations! Proclaim! Praise! Shout: 'The Lord has saved his people, the remnant of Israel!' See, I will bring them back from the land of the North and gather them from the far ends of earth; all of them: the blind and the lame, women with child, women in labour: a great company returning here. They had left in tears, I will comfort them as I lead them back; I will guide them to streams of water, by a smooth path where they will not stumble. For I am a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my first-born son.

Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; and so he can sympathise with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too lives in the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by God, as Aaron was. Nor did Christ give himself the glory of becoming high priest, but he had it from the one who said to him: You are my son, today I have become your father, and in another text: You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever.

#### Go; your faith has saved you

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.
